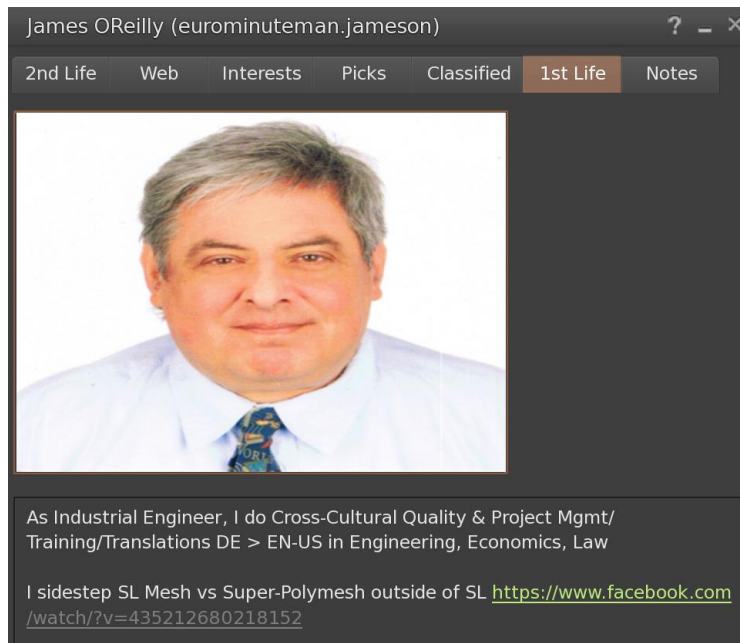


How to pay directly via the web ...

James O'Reilly told me of a direct payment via Transparency International. He goes in SL by the name Eurominuteman Jameson, Rez Date: 11/26/2007



James O'Reilly seems to know a lot about fraud and he happily shares his thoughts. He has taken on a personal mission to ensure that within SL there is no fundraisers being held for personal gain.

This way I did the payment. I did it twice as my input was 50 – and I assumed Euro - but in fact it is in local currency [UAH]. The process worked, but I was a bit left blind in doing. My Bank asked me to verify the transaction in UAH. I risked to press “I accept” really not knowing what the result would be. After it was done I saw 1,53 Euro have been taken off -- so I did it again with 5000 UAH. The buttons come up in Ukrainian language. Now as you have the document it shall be an easy go.

It looks like you don't need to give your real email – but I guess it's better you do if you need a tax receipt to reduce your income tax. I have not checked this. I will contact Transparency International in Berlin to see how this goes.

The data on the credit card are of course relevant – but they are, compared to other transactions, minimal [no living address was asked].

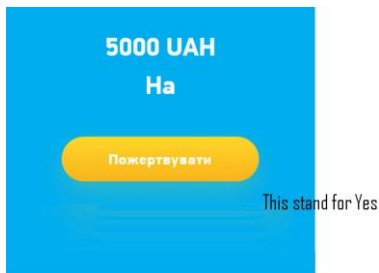

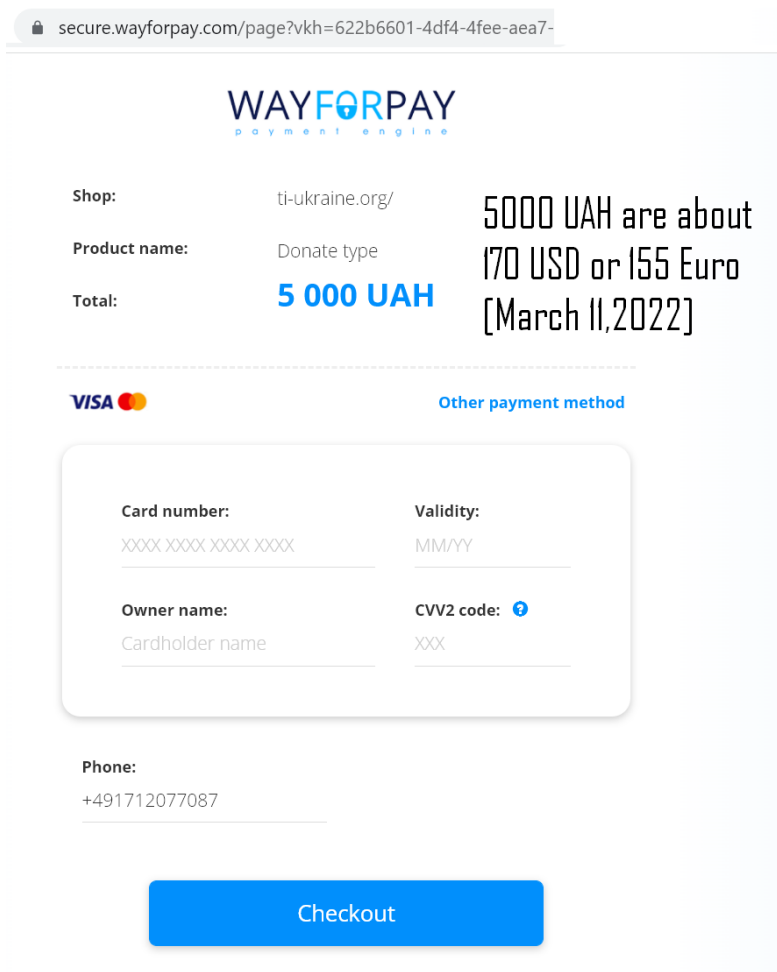

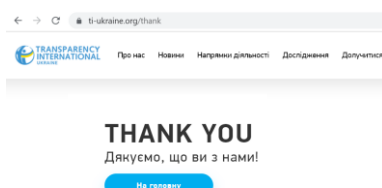
